- Attendance at all seminars is mandatory, any anticipated absence must be negotiated with the supervisor and group (no more than one absence is allowable). Seminar days will normally run from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.
- Students will meet bi-weekly with the supervisor for individual supervision. Please bring a Bi-Weekly Summary, including a Significant Incident Report, to this meeting.
- A typical Monday will include a devotional/theological reflection (weekly theme), and a combination of a clinical seminar, a didactic seminar, and an IPR seminar. Students are responsible to submit material for a clinical seminar on a rotating basis.
- A learning contract is due September 15th. This covenant is the student's learning goals for the unit. Your final evaluation will be based, in part, upon how you meet the goals you select for the unit.
- All students must contract for at least ten hours of pastoral care ministry a week in a clinical/parish setting. To qualify, these hours must include direct patient/parishioner contact, and be predominantly pastoral in nature. For example, hospital visitation, pastoral referrals, home visits, pastoral counseling, worship leadership (homily) typically meet this requirement. The ten hours is calculated on a fifteen-week basis. If you plan to use primarily a non-Avera setting, this must be pre-arranged with the supervisor involving a memorandum of understanding with the parish, etc. You are expected to spend four hours a week in reading and preparation.
- All students will need to establish a relationship with C.O.R.E. group and/or staff chaplain to provide the student and supervisor with a clinical site consultant.
- Required books this unit include: At the Will of the Body by Arthur Frank; and Counseling People with Cancer by John Aldredge-Clanton.

- Attendance at all seminars is mandatory, any anticipated absence must be negotiated with the supervisor and group (no more than one absence is allowable). Seminar days will normally run from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on Thursdays.
- Students will meet bi-weekly with the supervisor for individual supervision. Please bring a Bi-Weekly Summary, including a Significant Incident Report, to this meeting. These meetings will normally be held Wednesday afternoons.
- A typical Thursday will include a devotional/theological reflection, and a combination of two clinical seminars, a didactic seminar, and an IPR seminar. Students are responsible to submit material for a clinical seminar on a rotating basis.
- A learning contract is due September 18th. This covenant is the student's learning goals for the unit. Your final evaluation will be based, in part, upon how you meet the goals you select for the unit.
- All students must contract for at least sixteen hours of pastoral care ministry a week in a clinical/parish setting. To qualify, these hours must include direct patient/parishioner contact, and be predominantly pastoral in nature. For example, hospital visitation, pastoral referrals, home visits, pastoral counseling, worship leadership (homily) typically meet this requirement. The sixteen hours is calculated on a fifteen-week basis. If you plan to use primarily a non-Avera setting, this must be pre-arranged with the supervisor involving a memorandum of understanding with the parish, etc. You are expected to spend four hours a week in reading and preparation.
- All students will need to establish a relationship with C.O.R.E. group and/or staff chaplain to provide the student and supervisor with a clinical site consultant.
- Required books this unit include: At the Will of the Body by Arthur Frank; Counseling People with Cancer by John Aldredge-Clanton; and Memories of God by Roberta Bondi. These books are available through on-line services such as Amazon.com.
